### **Overview**

People For Action (PFA) is registered under Societies Act 1860. It commenced its journey in line with its object of Memorandum of Association no. 2, 4, 13, 16, 18, and 19 with the view of improving learning outcomes at scale in January 2019 through its Transform Schools programme by taking forward the lessons learnt from Kusuma's India programme over the last decade.

PFA on-boarded a committed senior management and core team in January 2019 to further the cause of quality education:

In line with its objectives and by virtue of the expertise of its team, PFA works to support and implement programmes of national importance in government secondary schools, particularly in under-resourced areas in the State of Odisha and disseminate its learning to other State governments.

### **Vision**

Every child and young person deserves the opportunity to realise their full potential and thrive.

### **Mission**

We improve learning outcomes for young people in India, increasing their access to better education and career opportunities.

### **Our Model**

People For Action's Transform Schools programme works with the government school system, where a majority of the country's children are enrolled. It supports better teaching and management to improve learning outcomes for children in India through six core interventions:

Transform Learning: Enables students at the start of secondary school to be at the learning level for their age leading to improving Student Learning Outcomes in government secondary schools

Transform Teaching: Strengthens teaching skills amongst English, Mathematics and Science teachers in a structured manner over two years to improve the quality of teaching




Transform School Management: Improves the HTs role clarity, management knowledge and skills over two years to enable them to effectively lead and manage the school

Transform PARity: Identifies and builds awareness and agency towards gender and other social norms which govern the decision-making processes in adolescents' lives, using Participatory Action Research (PAR) methodology


Transform Back To School: Supports re-entry of out of school children through campaigns and community outreach followed by accelerated in-school learning

Transform Technical Advice: Improves education programmes and systems through bespoke solutions to State education departments for quality improvement, real time monitoring, and dissemination

We leverage our rigorously tested models, resources and donor funding to provide technical assistance to the State government. ### **Our Work**

Building on lessons learnt from Kusuma's India programme, we commenced working in 4,290 schools in the State of Odisha. With rigorous monitoring and evaluation processes in place, we have put in place a robust system of programme assessment, review, and dissemination to support partner and other governments for wider policy change. Looking at the success and potential, JPAL South Asia chose to study our Transform

Learning programme through a Randomised Control Trial. PFA and the State came together to support the pilot and the full study.

### Our Reach

From our inception in January 2019, we have come a long way in reaching a large part of Odisha's education ecosystem. The numbers tell the story of evolving relationships and growing partnerships, with newer States being added to the vision of transforming secondary education:

"Various students assessments reflected that most students in our schools do not have learning levels equivalent to their classes - a big challenge for government to address. Transform's learning programme was unique in its approach to target poor learning levels with a very strong focus on teacher training. No such programme was ever implemented in the State. Learning levels reflected improvements and teachers learnt new teaching methods. We have now decided to expand the programme state wide"

### Key activities and achievements

The PFA team has seen massive traction and impact for its programmes from its very inception. From resource development and finalisation to trainings for effective implementation and monitoring, PFA has ensured all stakeholders, especially the governments are true partners in making the journey towards appropriate learning outcomes and student success. Some of the key activities and achievements to this end are:

### 1. <u>Transform Learning Programme</u>

- Odisha government commenced the scale up of the programme from 15 to 27 districts from 1 January 2019.
- PFA delivered training on 12 February 2019 of government officials and 423 trainers for implementation, teacher training and monitoring using online tools to support the scale-up,



- contributing to our vision of outpacing the learning deficit.
- Results analysis of 15 districts for the academic year 2018-2019 was completed on March 2019. The
  programme data continues to show very positive results, with all students passing out with enhanced
  learning levels.
- The J-PAL pilot study found in March 2019 that the programme to positively impact student performance across learning levels. It also found that the 69-day Transform Learning intervention was equivalent to 1.7-2.5 years of typical progress in school.



### 2. <u>Transform Teaching Programme</u>:

PFA used the lessons from teacher trainings in Odisha's Utkarsh programme and our teacher development approach to advocate for improvements in the State's teacher professional development. It successfully advocated for government to appoint a core committee for informing improvements in its programme. The committee appointed by government includes PFA core team and has a mandate to 1) Review and revise State's programme approach 2)

Develop training needs assessment and teacher competency assessments 3) Pilot online training and onsite support. An action plan for this has been developed.

#### 3. Transform School Management:

Odisha government commenced the school planning process in January 2019. Districts were issued guidelines and resources that were adapted using PFA's school management model. PFA undertook the Quality Assurance (QA) visits in two districts on 15 February 2019 to observe adherence to the guidelines and offer support in the planning processes. PFA will focus on improving the quality via training and handholding, and focusing on school plans on academic priorities.

#### 4. Library Improvement Programme

- Trained personnel from district level institutions for effective management of learning Resource Center Budharaja Nodal High School in Sambalpur on 11 March 2019.
- Annual plans for implementing learning and efficiently managing libraries were developed.

## 5. <u>Collaboration, Dissemination, Replication, and</u> Advocacy

A round table with Odisha government to discuss
J-Pal's pilot study findings from Cuttack districts
was completed in partnership with KTUK on 14
March 2019. The findings show that learning
gains are large in intervention schools and impact
all students. Programme yields better results
compared to other learning programmes in the



world. The design and timelines for the full evaluation were also presented, discussed and agreed with government. The key participants included, Core team from PFA, KTUK and dignitaries from the State education department: Mr. P. K. • PFA hosted a secondary education seminar in partnership with KTUK and Odisha government on 15 March 2019.
